



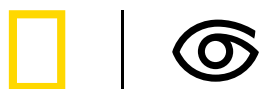

A DAY IN THE LIFE

ON EXPEDITION IN ALASKA

Venture far beyond Alaska's busy ports and piers to roadless places where glaciers sparkle, mountains soar and epic wildlife roams. You'll be guided by the rhythms of the wilderness, experiencing it from every angle without another ship in sight.

Breakfast: Savor Your Meal, Soak in a View

Epic scenery is everywhere in Alaska, and at a fjord-side breakfast, you might be treated to views of tumbling waterfalls or electric-blue icebergs as you enjoy fresh bread and pastries, a made-to-order omelet or other delicious dishes from the buffet.

Morning Excursion: Exploring at Water Level

Join a naturalist aboard a Zodiac and speed toward a glistening glacier that peeks through a bend in the fjord. Or board a kayak or paddleboard and glide across these iceberg-studded waters, on the lookout for otters, bald eagles and harbor seals.

Talks and Photo Tips

Head to the lounge for a presentation by your certified photo instructor or another member of your expedition team. Your undersea specialist may reveal footage of the vibrant marine life hidden beneath Alaska's nutrient-rich waters, while naturalists share insights into topics ranging from local orca pods to the area's glaciology.



Lunch: A Fresh Catch

Ship chefs use fresh, local ingredients whenever possible, including locally grown produce and fresh-caught fish. Savor an Alaska-inspired lunch, like a grilled salmon sandwich or a salad featuring wild berries.

Afternoon Excursion: Rainforest Walk

Put your new photo tips to the test during a walk through Tongass National Forest, exploring with our special access permits. Snap pictures as you stroll amid blooming wildflowers, or choose a path less traveled, bushwhacking through thick brush.



Downtime: On Whale Watch

With free time, take advantage of the ship's amenities: Read up on regional flora in the library, visit the open bridge or stand on deck to watch for wildlife. If whales are active nearby, your captain may linger so you can watch their behaviors. When conditions are right, a naturalist drops a hydrophone that lets you listen in on their underwater communications.



Ready for Recap

Gather in the lounge for drinks and hors d'oeuvres, followed by the nightly recap and a preview of tomorrow's adventures. On select departures, you may be joined by a representative from the Alaska Whale Foundation, who shares fascinating insights into humpback whale behavior and the ongoing research helping to protect these remarkable animals.

Dinner: Crab Feast

A culinary event that always earns rave reviews is the Dungeness crab feast—a mouth-watering taste of Alaska's wild bounty, washed down with local craft beers.



Adventures Under the Midnight Sun

Take advantage of the summer's lingering sunlight to capture golden hour photos or look for wildlife. If you're traveling later in the season, you may have a chance to spot the northern lights painting the night sky.

The 154-guest *Greg Mortimer* combines advanced technology with the intimate small-ship experience at the heart of our voyages. Four rapid-deploy Zodiac platforms maximize your time exploring Alaska's wild coastlines, while expansive observation decks, hydraulic viewing platforms, ocean-view lounges, outdoor hot tubs and a panoramic sauna offer spectacular places to spot wildlife and watch the landscape unfold.



EXPLORATION GUIDED BY EXPERTS

Every voyage aboard the *Greg Mortimer* is guided by the same expertise and operational excellence that have long distinguished National Geographic-Lindblad Expeditions. An exceptional 8:1 guest-to-staff ratio ensures personalized experiences led by veteran expedition leaders, naturalists and cultural specialists. With the agility and comfort needed to explore Alaska's most remote coasts, the *National Geographic Quest* and the *National Geographic Venture* continue our commitment to immersive expedition travel on this wild frontier.

Purpose-built for navigating Alaska's intricate waterways, the *National Geographic Quest* and her sister ship, the *National Geographic Venture*, bring a modern, clean-lined approach to expedition travel. With 50 cabins and exceptionally nimble design, they can slip into narrow fjords, quiet coves and secluded anchorages, offering access to the region's wildest places.



Twin Zodiac boarding platforms allow for quick disembarkation so you spend less time waiting and more time exploring. Kayaks and paddleboards invite you to discover sheltered inlets at water level, enjoying the up-close encounters with nature that define our explorations here.

On board, outward-facing cabins, expansive windows and tiered viewing platforms keep you connected to your surroundings at every turn—framing sapphire seas, breaching whales and shifting horizons. Amenities include a partially covered sundeck, a fitness center and a welcoming lounge and library with a full-service bar. In the dining room, menus draw on regional ingredients for a fresh, local taste of Alaska's wild bounty—complementing your explorations of this remarkable wilderness.

IGNITE THEIR SPIRIT OF DISCOVERY

The exclusive National Geographic Explorers-in-Training program transforms the natural world into a dynamic classroom for young travelers—and it's offered on every Alaska departure. Children and teens learn to explore like scientists through photography, video, drawing and other hands-on activities. National Geographic certified field educators mentor families through shared discoveries, while select kids-only moments build independence and confidence—all within the welcoming spirit of exploration that defines these expeditions.



PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Video Shoots

Young explorers can create their own nature documentaries with help from a certified photo instructor. They'll experiment with slow-motion and time-lapse video as they film everything from soaring eagles and calving glaciers to salmon runs and giant bear tracks.



License to Explore

Kids and teens may learn to operate a Zodiac and get their "driver's license." (Sorry adults, kids only.)



Microscopic Exploration

Young travelers can drop a net over the side of their Zodiac to collect plankton, then check it under a video microscope to see how it looks and moves.

Ice Cream Sundae Glaciers

Using ice cream and toppings, a certified field educator demonstrates how glaciers form, move and melt, showing how these rivers of ice shape Alaska's wild landscapes.





THE SCIENCE BEHIND THE WHALE SIGHTING

For National Geographic Explorer Andy Szabo, every whale encounter tells a story. As Founder and Director of the Alaska Whale Foundation (AWF), he's spent decades uncovering new insights into Alaska's humpback whales—and sharing those discoveries with National Geographic-Lindblad Expeditions guests. Here, Andy reflects on his work and what he hopes every traveler takes away from these extraordinary encounters.

When guests witness a humpback whale breach or bubble-net feed, it's often the moment they'll remember most. My hope is that they also leave with a deeper understanding of the remarkable animals they've encountered and the challenges they face in a changing ocean.

When I began studying humpback whales, I was fascinated by their behaviors and communications. But after the Pacific marine heatwave from 2014 to 2016, our research took on a new urgency. We began seeing fewer calves, more underweight whales and shifts in where whales were feeding, prompting us to expand our work to better understand the health of both whales and the ocean they depend on.

Support from the Lindblad Expeditions-National Geographic Fund has made this long-term research possible—and it's especially meaningful to share these discoveries with travelers. Every conversation helps connect an extraordinary wildlife encounter to the bigger picture of ocean health and conservation. For me, that's one of the most rewarding parts of the work—and where lasting stewardship begins.



ON BOARD WITH THE ALASKA WHALE FOUNDATION

On select departures, an AWF representative joins the voyage to share insights into area whale research. Guests can also contribute to whale-identification projects that support long-term monitoring and conservation initiatives.

Days 1-2 • Fairbanks

Visit the renowned Museum of the North, marvel at intricate ice sculptures at the Fairbanks Ice Museum and tour the Large Animal Research Station, home to musk oxen and reindeer.

Days 3-5 • Denali National Park

Travel aboard the first-class, glass-dome railcars of the *Alaska Railroad*, and settle into the Denali Bluffs Hotel (or similar), a prime basecamp near the park entrance. Spend three days exploring this vast wilderness, searching for Dall sheep, moose, caribou, wolves and grizzly bears on tours of the tundra. Additional opportunities include rafting the Nenana River, meeting the sled dogs of champion musher Jeff King or taking an optional flightseeing excursion around Denali's soaring peak.

Days 6-7 • Anchorage

Visit the Alaska Native Heritage Center, where exhibits and cultural demonstrations offer insight into the traditions and heritage of Alaska's Indigenous peoples.
