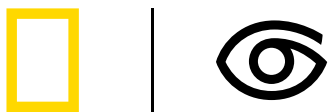

ICELAND & GREENLAND

VOLCANIC LANDSCAPES AND EPIC ICE

Iceland and Greenland reveal two sides of a restless Earth. In Iceland, volcanic forces shape geysers, waterfalls and moss-carpeted canyons, while across the Denmark Strait, Greenland's vast ice cap spills into fjords strewn with towering icebergs. Explore these worlds forged by fire and ice, tracing coastlines where Viking heritage and Inuit traditions endure. Here, nature sets the pace—from the midnight summer sun to the first shimmer of northern lights in early fall.

For the Scenery Seeker:

From Iceland's black-sand beaches to Greenland's glacial fjords, the landscapes here are nothing short of cinematic.

For the Wildlife Lover:

Iceland's cliffs teem with seabirds, including puffins, while offshore waters host humpbacks, orcas and other whale species. In Greenland, look for iconic Arctic creatures, including musk oxen, walrus and polar bears.

For the Culture Enthusiast:

Discover cultures shaped by Norse and Inuit traditions, from Iceland's vibrant coastal communities to Greenland's ancient farming settlements.

For the Active Traveler:

Experience elemental environments up close—hike to thundering waterfalls and volcanic craters in Iceland, or explore Greenland's tundra and fjords by kayak or Zodiac and on guided shore landings.

For the Young Explorer:

Select Iceland and Greenland itineraries feature the exclusive National Geographic Explorers-in-Training program, designed to engage and inspire travelers ages 18 and under.

When to Go: June–September

Spring and summer bring long days and abundant wildlife. Travel near the summer solstice for nearly endless daylight, or in early fall for a chance to see the northern lights.

SVALBARD & NORWAY

WITNESS THE WILD BEAUTY OF THE FAR NORTH

Few places showcase the drama of their creation like Norway, where a maze of rock and water cuts the coastline from tip to tail. Sail the country's iconic fjords, or set your sights on Svalbard, an archipelago framed by snowy peaks and ice-checked waters.

For the Scenery Seeker:

From the waterfall-laced fjords of the mainland to the snowscapes of Svalbard, Norway has some of the most stunning scenery in the far north.

For the Wildlife Lover:

Svalbard's snowy shores are as wild as the Serengeti. Set out on an Arctic safari to spot polar bears on the ice, walrus hauled out ashore and reindeer prancing across tundra.

For the Active Traveler:

Kayak amid sparkling icebergs and soaring fjords, and hike sweeping glacial valleys and jagged granite peaks.

For the Photographer:

A National Geographic Photographer joins every voyage to help you bring home your best photos.

When to Go: April-June

In spring, Svalbard is covered in ice and snow and bathed in astonishing light. The landscapes come alive in the summer when the ice starts to recede, offering more chances for wildlife watching.

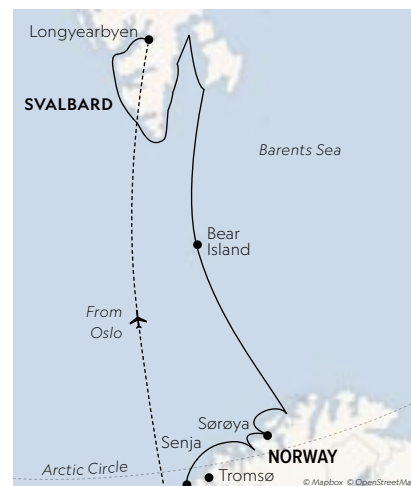

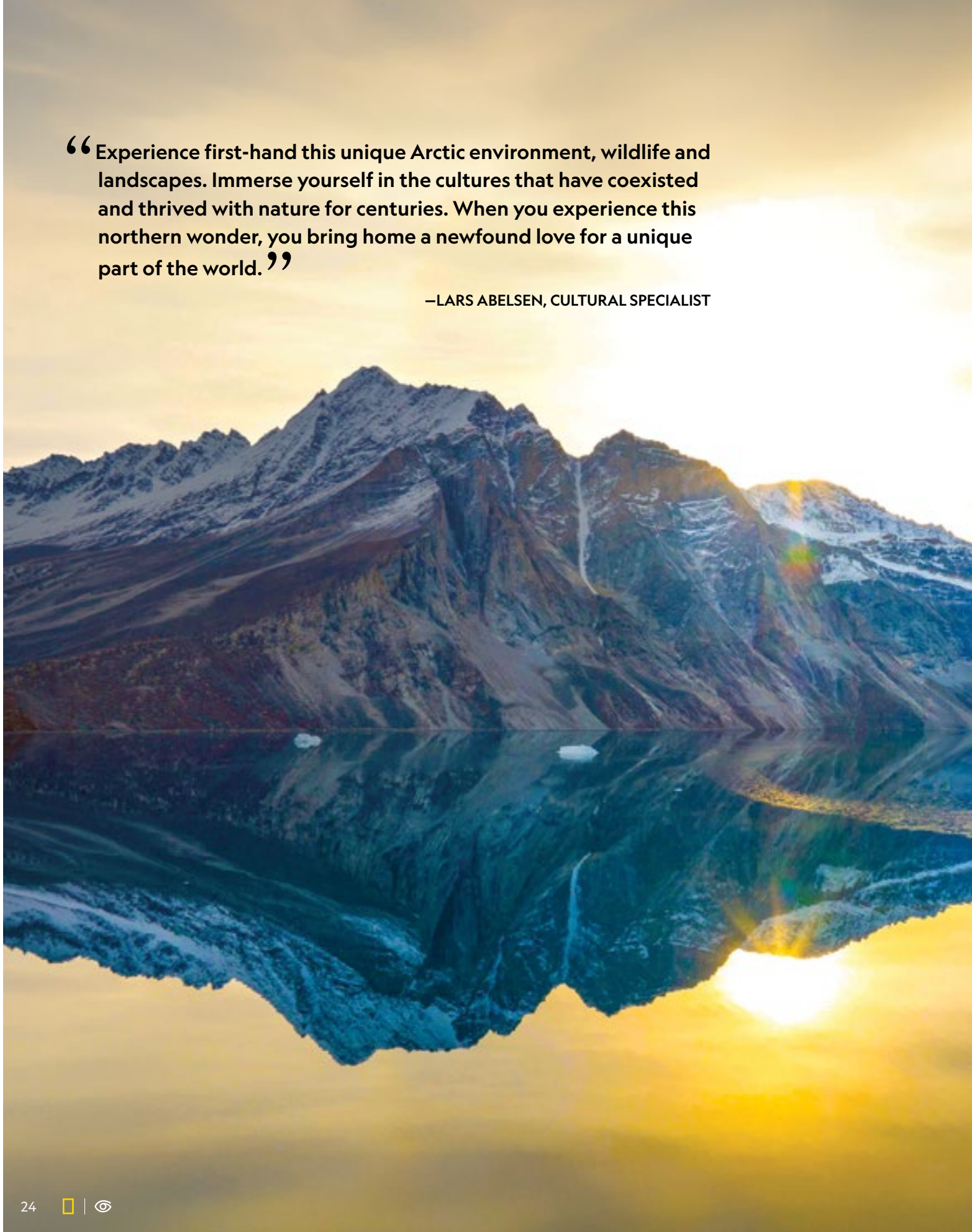

CANADA

IN THE WAKE OF GREAT EXPLORERS

In the high reaches of the Canadian Arctic, near-mythic species like musk oxen and belugas rule a wild kingdom of ice and snow. Venture into their world on a journey through the fabled Northwest Passage, and discover the cultures that have thrived on this wild frontier. Or trace the lineage of Arctic exploration to the Maritimes, where vestiges of the Vikings, Basque whalers and French settlers intermingle in this once-popular landing spot for westward voyagers.

For the Scenery Seeker:

In the Northwest Passage, explore glacier-carved islands and channels that stretch for hundreds of miles—a stunning display of raw geology and big ice.

For the Wildlife Lover:

Canada is home to an incredible profusion of wildlife, including polar bears, beluga whales and walruses. You might spot rare or reclusive species, like musk oxen and narwhals.

For the Culture Enthusiast:

Delve into Canada's Indigenous cultural heritage while meeting with artisans from Inuit communities, and explore the rich seafaring traditions of the colorful fishing villages in the maritime regions.

For the Historian:

Hear the dramatic stories of the Vikings who settled on Canada's North Atlantic shores and the polar explorers who sought out the icy frontier of the Northwest Passage.

When to Go: August–September

Summer welcomes the warmest temperatures of the year—ideal for outdoor exploration. Ice in the Northwest Passage has receded to allow for a full transit and deeper exploration of remote inlets and coves.

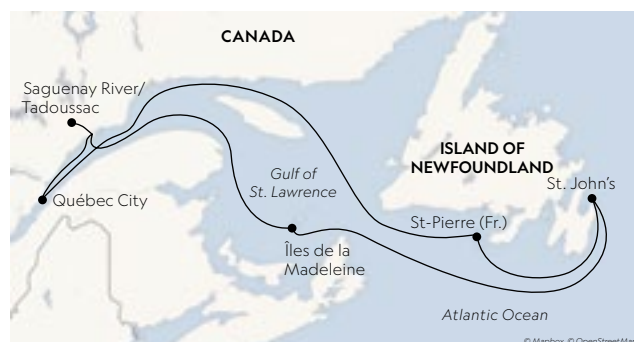
