INTRODUCING THE *GREG MORTIMER*

SETTING A NEW COURSE IN CENTRAL AMERICA

In 2027, the Greg Mortimer arrives in Costa Rica and Panama, bringing small-ship intimacy and a spirit of exploration to some of the region's most remote corners.

Launched in 2019, the *Greg Mortimer* blends cutting-edge design with the intimate scale of a small expedition ship, welcoming just 154 guests in 77 comfortable staterooms. Her innovative inverted X-Bow™ provides exceptional stability along open coasts, while her compact size allows access to secluded ports and tropical waterways beyond the reach of larger vessels.

Each day unfolds with seamless exploration, as Zodiac landings bring guests quickly ashore to wild coastlines and hidden inlets. Expansive decks and over-the-water viewing platforms invite moments of discovery as you sail—whether you're watching dolphins play or seabirds trace the sky overhead.

On board, welcoming lounges, a library and open-air gathering spaces foster a relaxed, communal atmosphere. Between excursions, guests can unwind in the sauna or top-deck hot tubs as the wild tropics of Central America unfold just beyond the rail.

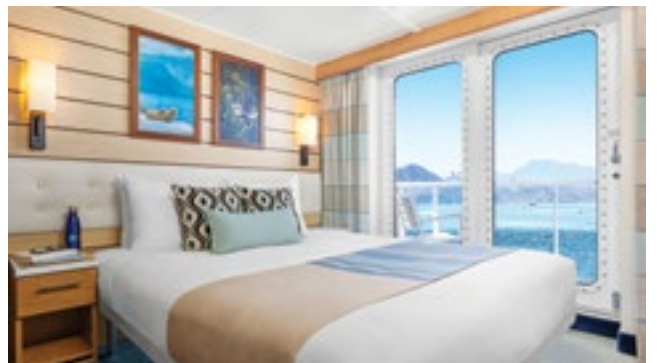
BUILT FOR AWE

NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC QUEST

Purpose-built for immersive exploration in the tropical wilds of Central America and Colombia, the 50-cabin *National Geographic Quest* is exceptionally nimble and perfectly suited to these biodiverse shores. She can anchor off tiny isles, slip into secluded bays for private snorkeling excursions and trace winding jungle waterways inaccessible to larger ships.

Equipped with a fleet of kayaks, stand-up paddleboards and Zodiacs, the *National Geographic Quest* allows for in-depth exploration independent of ports or piers. A suite of underwater exploration tools—including high-definition cameras and video microscopes—reveals the vibrant marine life thriving beneath the surface of turquoise seas.

Sleek and modern, the ship features expansive open decks and floor-to-ceiling windows that keep guests immersed in the surrounding landscape. In the lounge, daily Recaps bring each day's discoveries to life, while open Bridge access offers a behind-the-scenes look at the skill and precision required to navigate the region's hidden channels and coastal inlets.



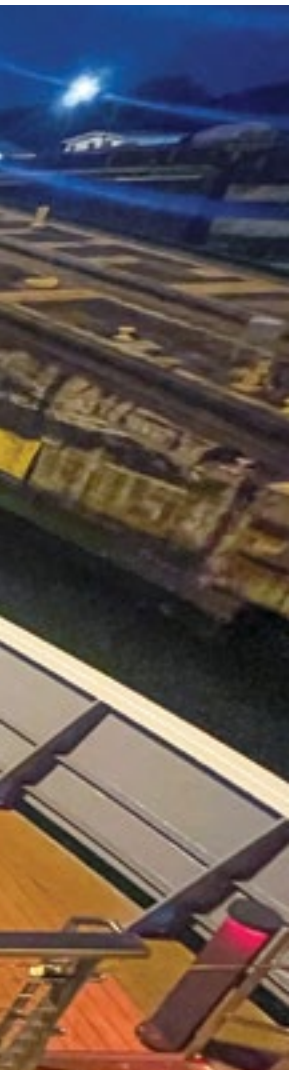

THE PANAMA CANAL

A STORIED CROSSING BETWEEN TWO OCEANS

Linking the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans through the heart of the tropics, the Panama Canal is a corridor where engineering and nature exist in close conversation. Experiencing this storied passage aboard the *National Geographic Quest* allows you to take it in gradually, with time to notice both the mechanics at work and the living landscape that frames the journey.

From on deck, watch as the ship moves slowly through the locks, rising and falling with the water as massive gates open and close just beyond arm's reach. An overnight stay in the Panama Canal Zone offers rare perspectives by day and after dark, when the canal's lights reflect across the water and the sailing unfolds with a quieter rhythm.

Beyond the locks, the scenery shifts. Dense rainforest lines the waterway, forming a carefully protected corridor that plays a vital role in the canal's success—stabilizing the watershed that supplies the freshwater required to operate the locks. Within this preserved landscape, wildlife thrives. Zodiac landings bring guests ashore to walk elevated boardwalks through a canopy alive with birds and monkeys, or to discover Barro Colorado Island, where scientists have studied the lowland tropical forests for generations.

Tracing the canal from ocean to ocean, with ample time to explore along the way, reveals more than a passage between seas—it offers a deeper understanding of the interconnected roles of the wild rainforest and this remarkable feat of human design.

COSTA RICA

FROM RAINFOREST TO REEF

Costa Rica is one of the most biologically rich places on Earth, shaped by elemental forces and unwavering environmental stewardship. Here, volcanic landscapes anchor lush rainforests, and rivers run from the highlands to the sea, sustaining mangroves and lagoons along the way.

Rainforest, river and reef are part of a single, living whole—one best understood by exploring both the country's emerald jungles and golden coastlines. By pairing immersive land exploration with expedition cruising—with your ship serving as a seamless base camp—National Geographic-Lindblad Expeditions reveals the full scale of Costa Rica's wild heart.





THE LAND EXPERIENCE

In the shadow of Arenal Volcano, rainforest thrives in fertile soil shaped by tectonic force and tropical rain. Travelers can walk suspension bridges through the canopy, follow forest trails with expert naturalists and soak in geothermal springs warmed by the volcano's lingering heat. Wildlife appears at every level—sloths tucked into cecropia branches, toucans flashing overhead and tree frogs hidden in leaf litter.

Farther west, elevation and climate shift dramatically. At Rincón de la Vieja, hike past steaming fumaroles and waterfalls fed by volcanic springs, where dense forest gives way to cooler, mist-laced cloud forest higher up. In Guanacaste's tropical dry forest—one of the largest in Central America—you'll explore open woodlands and flowering trees that support species uniquely adapted to seasonal heat and drought, from mantled howler monkeys to white-throated magpie-jays and white-nosed coatis.



THE SEA EXPERIENCE

As jungle rivers reach the Pacific, the story continues along the coast. On the Osa Peninsula—one of the most remote and biologically intense regions in the country—rainforest spills to the shoreline and mangroves root in calm, protected waters. Offshore, coral communities flourish where nutrient-rich currents meet the land.



From the deck of your expedition ship, explore this dynamic edge by Zodiac and kayak, navigating quiet inlets and scanning the treeline for monkeys and scarlet macaws. Snorkel warm, clear waters alive with tropical fish or step ashore on palm-fringed beaches where forest and ocean meet. Here, the connection between highland rivers and Pacific waters becomes tangible—revealing the seamless continuity of land and sea.

What age groups would enjoy expedition cruising?

There is something for everyone, from the second-grader fascinated by ship navigation, to the teenager who loves the freedom of kayaking, to the grandparent who never misses a naturalist talk. Your family makes memories together, and yet every generation can enjoy the experience in their own way.

What types of activities can children participate in?

Any of our expert-led excursions, from zip-lining to snorkeling with colorful fish.

Are there accommodation options for families?

Families often reserve adjacent rooms that turn two cabins into a family suite.



What can kids do on the ship?

Kids tend to love downtime on board: They are free to roam and explore their interests, but never far from family. They can examine footage of sea creatures with an undersea specialist or visit the open Bridge to see the captain demonstrate how navigation instruments work. They might read a book in the lounge, or play a board game with new friends. They have just enough independence—and plenty of ways to stay entertained.



How far ahead of time should you book an expedition cruise for your family?

We recommend booking as far out as possible so you have flexibility to reserve the cabins and dates that suit your family. Booking early also gives you plenty of time to research fun facts about your destination together and to prepare for the adventure ahead.

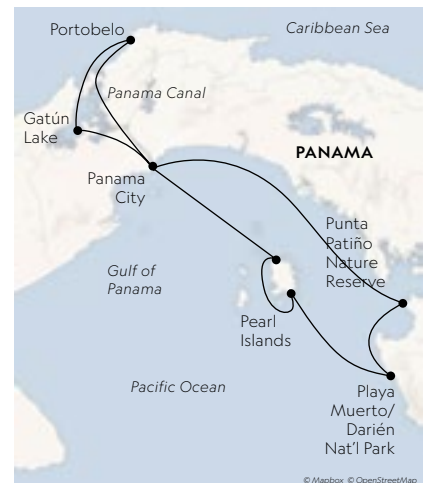

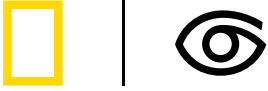
