

Experience Galápagos From a New Perspective

Every member of our team—from our naturalists and photographers to our expedition leaders—is committed to

Many of our veteran guides are Galapagueños; in addition to sharing their extensive knowledge of island species and habitats, they also offer an authentic connection to the region's culture. Exploring in small groups, you will have the opportunity to hear different perspectives every day, and because there are no group assignments, you can gravitate toward naturalists who share your interests.

Snorkel or scuba dive* with acrobatic sea lions, go on a photo walk to capture up-close images of blue-footed boobies, take a ride in a glass-bottom boat, and much more. You can explore your way every day.

In-Depth Undersea Program

Our extensive undersea program reveals the wonders hidden in Galápagos waters. Each voyage features an undersea specialist who documents the marine environment, gathering footage for daily recaps in the lounge so that all guests can glimpse the fascinating sea creatures and their oceanic habitats.

Sustainable practices are also embedded in our operations so that every aspect of your experience reflects this unique part of the planet—from the food served on board, to special excursions to island farms and schools, and the perspectives shared by the local researchers and community leaders who join us along the way.





Life on Board

Whether you sail Galápagos aboard National Geographic Endeavour II or National Geographic Islander II, your home base in the archipelago is a destination in its own right, featuring superior amenities and expedition tools to ensure your time on board is equally rewarding as your time on shore.

Our purpose-built expedition ships take you deep into the natural sanctuaries of the Galápagos for close encounters of the wildest kind. Each vessel is geared for exploration above and beneath the waves, with a fleet of Zodiacs, a custom-designed glass-bottom boat, kayaks and stand-up paddleboards, and dedicated snorkeling gear for each guest.

Gracious gathering spaces foster the camaraderie that is a hallmark of our expeditions. Join your fellow travelers on our expansive, open-air observation decks and look for the seabirds and the marine mammals that inhabit

these rich waters. Visit the captain on the open Bridge to learn about navigation, or read up on Charles Darwin and other Galápagos luminaries in the ship library before heading to the lounge for a lively recap highlighting the day's discoveries.

Every meal you enjoy on board offers a taste of your island surroundings by way of our pioneering farm-to-table program, which sources everything from avocados and bananas to coffee beans from more than 40 local farms. Developed in partnership with Ecuadorian chefs, our menus reflect the culinary traditions of the region and accommodate the diverse dietary preferences of our guests—we offer

a range of both meat- and plant-based options as well as alcoholic beverages and zero-proof cocktails crafted from island ingredients.

Take some time to relax and rejuvenate at sea with our wellness program, designed to connect you more deeply with your oceanic surroundings.

Greet the day with a morning stretch session on deck, unwind with a massage in the spa, or indulge in a tailored treatment that incorporates natural elements from the islands. Each ship has a windowed fitness center, while *National Geographic Islander II* offers a plunge-pool and sauna.



Where Exploration Meets Conservation

Throughout more than 50 years exploring Galápagos, Lindblad Expeditions has formed important connections with people working to conserve and protect the archipelago and its unique wildlife sanctuaries. Our network spans everyone from scientists and researchers to community leaders, farmers, and artisans—and our guests often enjoy unique opportunities to meet some of these specialists and hear about their role in sustaining the Galápagos.



Farm-to-Table and Artisan Programs

Through our pioneering farm-to-table program, we purchase more than 30 tons of local organic produce annually—an initiative that supports family farms throughout the archipelago. On select voyages, guests will have the opportunity to visit the first hydroponic farm in the Galápagos—which grows everything from avocados and bananas to lettuce and figs—and learn about sustainable agricultural practices that work in harmony with island habitats.

Throughout decades of exploring the Galápagos, Lindblad Expeditions has worked ardently to design and promote a model of sustainable tourism that supports local communities and safeguards the archipelago's precious species and habitats for generations to come.

Our artisan fund empowers the local Galápagos artisan community by offering training programs, supplying workspaces and equipment, and selling locally made goods on board to support regional artisans. For example, in 2011, we invited a Ugandan beadmaker to hold a 'paper-to-pearls' workshop for local Galápagos residents on how to transform paper waste into beautiful beaded jewelry. Today, artisans are passing on the skills they learned, fostering an ongoing, decade-long legacy of sustainable handcraft development.



Grosvenor Teacher Fellowship

The Grosvenor Teacher Fellowship is a professional development opportunity for educators made possible by a partnership between Lindblad Expeditions and the National Geographic Society. Fellows are hosted aboard our voyages for an impactful, field-based experience that is designed to inspire new ways of teaching students, engaging colleagues, and bringing geographic awareness into learning environments and communities.

Science at Sea

Through an agreement with Galápagos National Park, our expedition ships serve as platforms for science, facilitating studies and advancing the training of young local researchers.

The fleet has transported scientists—along with delicate eggs and hatchlings—for the Mangrove Finch Project; hosted researchers working on the Marine Invasive Species project by assisting them with collecting plastic marine debris; served as a base camp for National Geographic Explorers, including a team deploying a deep-sea camera system; and more. Lindblad Expeditions-National Geographic collaborates with Galápagos National Park on Explora Galápagos, offering the opportunity for local teachers, park wardens, farmers, and other community members to experience the national park and the Lindblad Expeditions-National Geographic guest experience.

Witness Animals in Action

Galápagos wildlife is legendary for its lack of fear, and on expeditions to the islands you can stand mere feet from all kinds of creatures and carefully contemplate their fascinating behaviors. Our veteran local naturalists are highly skilled at spotting and interpreting wildlife activity so you can enjoy unforgettable encounters with an array of species. Here are some of our favorite animal behaviors in action.

The Elaborate Dance of the Blue-Footed Booby

Both male and female blue-footed boobies sport the eponymous teal feet, but color is especially important for males. The bluer the bird's feet, the healthier he is—and the better his mating game. When courting, males slowly lift each foot for a female's close inspection.



Flightless Feedings for the Cormorant

Galápagos is the only place in the world to find the flightless cormorant. With few land predators and a rich ocean close to its nest, this species has lost its ability to fly. At mealtime, flightless cormorants dive 50 feet to spear octopus, eel, and fish.



Curious Sea Lions at Play

Galápagos sea lions are incredibly curious and acrobatic, often joining snorkelers in an aquatic ballet. Ashore you might see youngsters nursing or adolescents in a pile. They are thigmotactic, meaning they seek out bodily contact.

The World's Only Oceangoing Lizard Adapted for Feeding at Sea

After foraging for algae in chilly water, marine iguanas can lose up to 50°F of body heat. Piling atop one another and basking in the sun helps them warm up for their next dive. While on land, they also must rid their bodies of saltwater—watch for frequent 'sneezes' as they expel excess salt.



Complex Courtship of the Waved Albatross

Courtship for the waved albatross consists of multiple steps—from bill clacking to bowing, honking, and sky pointing—and all is performed with precision as partners strive to mirror each other. They speed up with practice, and when multiple pairs are courting, we may witness a frenzy of calls and movements.



The Frigate's In-Flight Flirtation

The islands' two species of frigatebirds—magnificent and great—both have unusual ways of attracting mates. Males inflate a thin red pouch on their throat called a gular sac to create a visible, balloon-like bulge. Adding to the display, they clatter their bills, wave their heads, and call at females in flight.



Mealtime for Toothless Tortoises

When they're not napping—up to 16 hours a day—



Galápagos tortoises can be found grazing on grass, leaves, and fruit. The world's largest living tortoise, these toothless giants can consume up to 80 pounds of vegetation per day.

Watch how they use the bony outer edges of their mouth to mash up food.

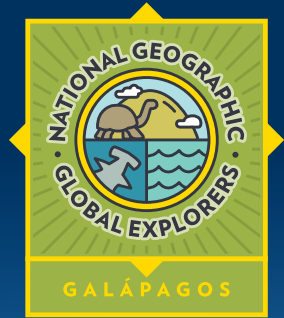

Nurture Their Passion For Exploration

One of the most rewarding sights in Galápagos is witnessing the gleam of discovery in a young traveler's eyes, whether they're walking alongside a giant tortoise or watching blue-footed boobies perform a courtship dance. Moments like these are especially meaningful when complemented with the learning opportunities in our exclusive National Geographic Global Explorers program.

Developed in conjunction with National Geographic Education, this hands-on, interactive program teaches kids and teens 18 and under how to explore like scientists and tell the stories of the archipelago's legendary wildlife. Young adventurers are led by certified field educators who are experts at using the Galápagos as a natural classroom.

Kids will hone their observation skills and learn to capture and share their experiences through photographs, videos, drawings, and more. With a range of activities to choose from, such as snorkeling with sea lions or earning a Zodiac driver's 'license,' this flexible program encourages young travelers to explore their own interests, whether it's marine biology, geology, or photography.





National Geographic Global Explorer Program Highlights

Wildlife Watching

Zip along shore in a Zodiac, then hike in search of Galápagos wildlife, like barking sea lions and marine iguanas. Snap photos with your smartphone and jot notes in your official National Geographic Global Explorers Field Notebook.

Microscopic Exploration

Drop a net over the side of your Zodiac to collect plankton, then check it under a video microscope to see how it looks and moves.

Video Shoots

Get tips from your National Geographic certified photo instructor on how to create impressive slow-motion and timelapse videos, then test out your new skills in the field.

License to Explore

Learn to operate a Zodiac and earn your 'driver's license.' (Sorry adults, kids only.)

Check Your List

Head to the ship lounge to review the wildlife you saw and mark it in your notebook. Include creatures big and small—whether it's a lava lizard or a giant tortoise. Tally your points to keep track of your progress on becoming certified as a National Geographic Global Explorer.



New Friends and Fun Adventures

Meet up with your new friends for fun activities with your certified field educator. Depending on the day, it might be a pizza dinner, games in the lounge, a special hike, or other surprises.

Eyes to the Night Sky

Head to the top deck to watch the stars come out as the sun goes down. Find and record constellations with the help of your certified field educators.

The Galápagos Islands



ISABELA

Toast crossing the Equator at Volcán Ecuador, the northernmost of the island's six great shield volcanoes. Keep an eye out for whales and dolphins as you ply these rich waters, once the haunt of whalers and pirates.



SANTIAGO

Explore tide pools and search for fur seals in quiet grottos on this island where a coastal forest and spectacular geological formations are high points.



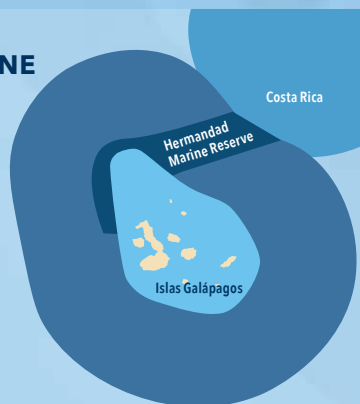
FERNANDINA

One of the most active oceanic volcanoes in the world, it's home to the strange flightless cormorant and the largest population of marine iguanas.



HISTORIC MILESTONE IN GALÁPAGOS

The new Hermandad Marine Reserve expands the current Galápagos Marine Reserve by almost 50 percent and extends northwest to the Costa Rican maritime border.



FLOREANA

Follow a trail along a rose-pink lagoon across Punta Cormorant. Visit Post Office Bay, founded by 18th-century whalers, on this mysterious island with an intriguing human history.



BARTOLOMÉ

Climb to the summit of this volcanic wonderland, then snorkel and swim from a golden beach.



GENOVESA

Sail to the remote northern realm of the Galápagos, a seabird paradise bathed in warm tropical waters.



NORTH SEYMOUR

Encounter nesting frigatebirds, plus land and marine iguanas, and enjoy a beautiful coastal walk.



SOUTH PLAZA

Sea lions greet us at South Plaza, an uplifted volcanic block carpeted in salt-loving succulents and teeming with wildlife.



SANTA CRUZ

Call at Puerto Ayora, the largest town and headquarters of both the Charles Darwin Research Station and Galápagos National Park. Head to the lush, green highlands to see giant tortoises roaming in the wild.



SAN CRISTÓBAL

Search for red-footed boobies and the endemic mockingbird and lava lizard—found only on this easternmost island. Explore Baquerizo Moreno, where sea lion colonies thrive in the middle of town.



RÁBIDA

Snorkel along the rocky coastline among schools of tropical fish and curious sea lions, before landing on a brilliant red beach to look for both land and sea birds.



ESPAÑOLA

Home to swallow-tailed gulls, Española mockingbirds, Nazca boobies and, seasonally, the world's only population of waved albatross.

Back-to-Back Galápagos Voyages

Set sail on *Wild Galápagos Escape* or *Galápagos Aboard National Geographic Endeavour II* and stay on board for the consecutive departure of your voyage to explore even more of the archipelago. Watch for monkeys and macaws in the canopy and pink dolphins splashing in the river, and spend time with the indigenous *ribereños* in their remote jungle communities.

Hotel del Parque Guayaquil

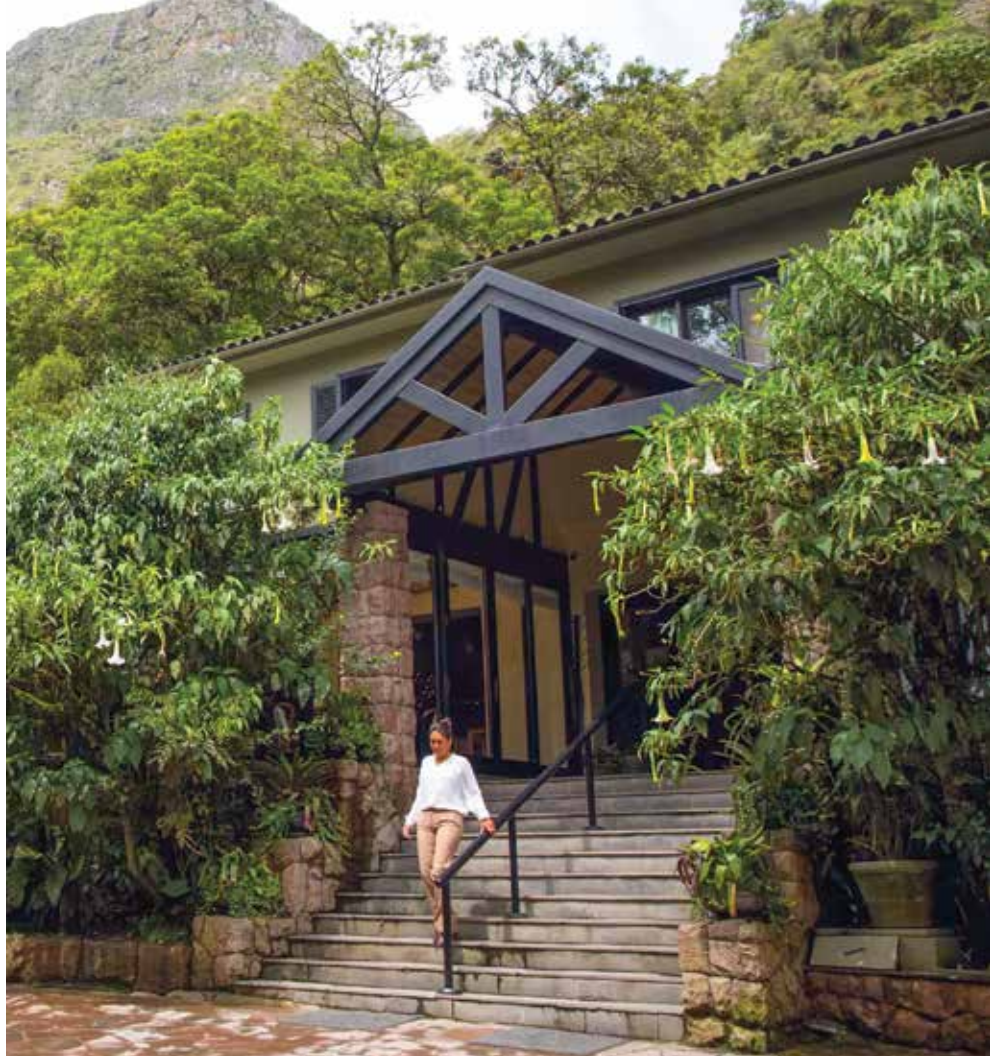

Machu Picchu

Travelers combining their Galápagos voyage with our *Exploring Peru: Land of the Inca* expedition will enjoy the rare opportunity to stay at the historic Belmond Sanctuary Lodge, the only accommodation adjacent to Machu Picchu. Awaken to views of the legendary site, and enjoy first-rate amenities, including a tranquil orchid garden and a spa that employs Inca wellness techniques.

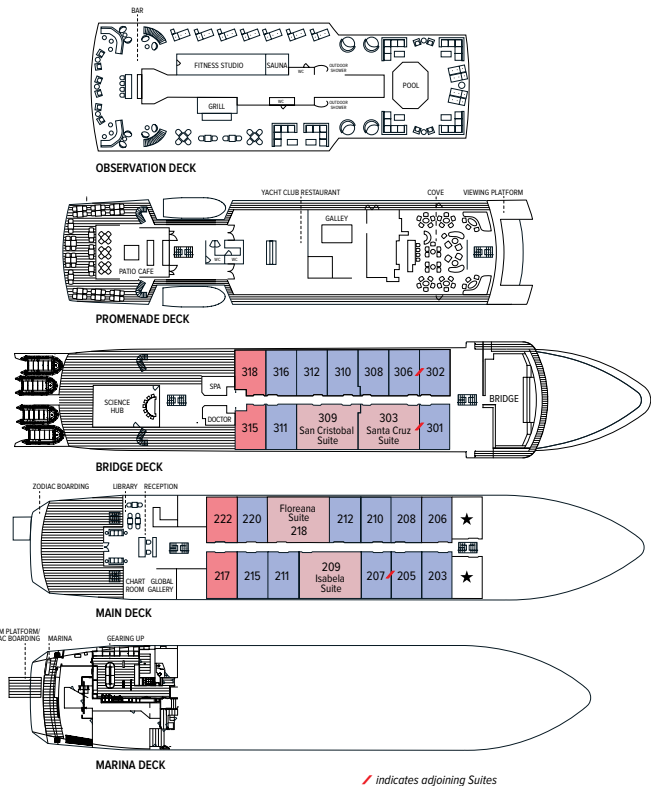

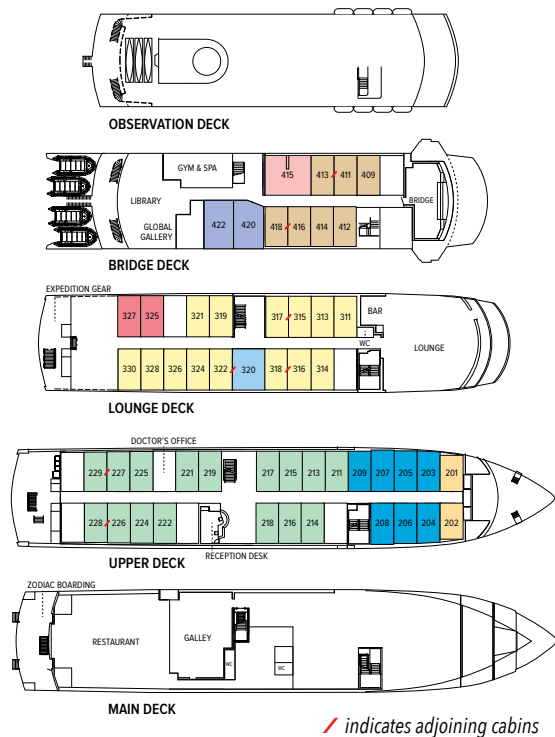
