On a visit to this volcanic archipelago in the United Kingdom, view abandoned stone huts that attest to human habitation from the Bronze Age until 1930. See page 34.

Pico Island

Recognized for its centuries-old viniculture, this volcanic Azorean island—where lava stone corrals protect vines from wind and seawater—is an uncharacteristic spot for wine tasting. See page 30.

L'Anse aux Meadows National Historic Site

North America's earliest known European structures are Norse dwellings built around 1,000 AD and not unearthed until the 1960s. Now they're part of a scenic national park that we explore on voyages to Newfoundland. See page 15.



Himeji Castle

One of Japan's most magnificent castles, the 14th-century Himeji is a well-preserved vestige of the feudal era. Tour this walled beauty—known as the White Egret Castle—which has eight keeps encircled by moats. See pages 42 and 43.



Marae Taputapuātea

Visit Ra'iatea to see this sacred gathering spot, the centuries-old center of Polynesian spirituality and culture for Mā'ohi people living in a region that stretches from Hawaii to New Zealand. See pages 57 and 59.

Borobudur Temple

Discover the world's largest Buddhist temple, surrounded by volcanic peaks on the Indonesian island of Java. Adorned with hundreds of statues, the 9th-century temple was erected to help the faithful reach nirvana. See page 47.

Five Highlights of Machu Picchu

When Machu Picchu was revealed to the outside world following Hiram Bingham's 1911 rediscovery of the site, it became a symbol of the unknowable past—a massive feat of construction built entirely by hand amid high Andean peaks. Since then, scholars have examined Machu Picchu's nearly 200 structures for insights into life in this royal Inca sanctuary. These five Machu Picchu highlights reveal clues to the history and culture of the ancient Inca.

The Watchman's Hut

Located just inside the visitor's entrance, this lookout provides sweeping views of the site's agricultural terraces, framed by Andean peaks. The neighboring Funerary Rock, a mysterious carved boulder, might have been used for animal sacrifices or mummification before funerals.



Intihuatana

One of many objects of both religious and astronomical significance in Machu Picchu's ritual area, the Intihuatana points directly at the sun on the winter solstice. This carved boulder helped track the passage of time and shows a cultural connection between supernatural forces and earthly events.



Temple of the Sun

Also called the Observatory, this building's elegant semi-circular structure would have been an inspiring sight with its original gold embellishments, gleaming in the sun at the high point of the ritual area. The temple's windows were positioned to calculate the summer solstice, while the central space hosted priestly rituals.



Stairway of the Fountains

This cleverly engineered hydraulic system brought water from two springs a halfmile away through a system of channels to feed a steady stream of water into Machu Picchu's



stream of water into Machu Picchu's fountains. In addition to providing a clean public water supply, the unique system also helped protect the hillside from erosion.

The Temple of the Three Windows

One of Machu Picchu's best-preserved buildings, this temple sits in what Hiram Bingham described as the "Sacred Plaza." Some archaeolo-



gists believe that the windows represent three aspects of the Inca world view: the underground (Uku-Pacha), the heavens (Hanan-Pacha), and the present (Kay-Pacha).

On our expeditions to Peru, visitors are invited to linger late into the afternoon at Machu Picchu, long after most visitors depart. Visit **expeditions.com/peru** to learn more about this extended experience.



The Jahan

CAPACITY: 48 guests in 24 outside cabins. REGISTRY: Vietnam. OVERALL LENGTH: 230 feet.

PUBLIC AREAS: The ship is fully air-conditioned. Outdoor areas include the Terrace Deck, with both covered and open-air spaces, a small swimming pool, and a full service bar. The lounge, located on the Upper Deck, has a library and facilities for films, slide shows, and presentations. Guests are welcome on the "open Bridge" to meet the captain and officers and learn about navigation.

CABINS: Every cabin is exceptionally spacious and comfortable. All face outside, and all have glass doors and private balconies for enjoying the scenery along the Mekong River and its tributaries. There is a mix of single-bedded and queen-size bedded cabins. Each has private facilities and hair dryer, individual climate control, and a mini bar. A choice of pillows is provided on request.

SPECIAL FEATURES: There is a spa, offering a choice of massage treatments, and fitness room with steam bath and treadmill, stationary bicycle, and elliptical trainer. The boutique has a fine selection of local artwork and textiles. Morning Tai Chi classes are offered on the Terrace Deck.

CATEGORY 1: Main Deck #103-112 Each of these large cabins has a private balcony with floor-to-ceiling glass doors that let in abundant light. Cabins 103-104 have single beds (which can be pushed together on request), and #105-112 have queensize beds.

CATEGORY 2: Upper Deck #201-208 Each of these large 3 cabins has a private balcony with floor-to-ceiling glass doors that let in abundant light. Cabins 201-202 have single beds (which can be pushed together on request), and 203-208 have queen-size beds.

CATEGORY 3: Main Deck #113-114 and Upper Deck #209-210 Each exceptionally large cabin has a queen-size bed and a private balcony with floor-to-ceiling glass doors that let in abundant light. There is a television and private DVD player. Each balcony has two sun beds and a table.
