As part of our exclusive undersea program, developed in partnership with National Geographic, an undersea specialist joins every departure of *National Geographic Orion* and *National Geographic Resolution*. They use a high-definition video camera and deploy a Remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV) that allows us to peer up to 1,000 feet beneath the surface. Footage is shared during daily recaps, so all guests can witness the sea creatures that thrive in the watery world below us.






Discover a Rich Tapestry of Cultures

Asian Wildlife Above and Beneath the Waves

Wildlife can often go overlooked on a continent renowned for its cultural treasures—so travelers may be surprised to find that some of the planet's most intriguing species reside in Asia's secluded corners. From the acrobatic orangutans that swing through Malaysian jungles to the elusive dugongs that swim off coastal Japan, mesmerizing creatures await here, whether you wish to explore on shore or under water.

Meet the Orangutans of Borneo & Sumatra

These endangered primates have many human characteristics—and they will capture your heart when we have the rare opportunity to observe them in their natural environment at a leading rehabilitation center.



Dive into the Coral Triangle

At the heart of this epicenter of sea life, Raja Ampat's reef system is carpeted in a tapestry of corals that harbors 1,500 types of fish, five of the world's seven sea turtle species, and seven kinds of giant clams.



See Komodo Dragons in the Wild

It's a thrill to encounter the world's largest lizards in their spectacular tropical island home, the only place on Earth to see Komodo Dragons in their natural habitat.



Swim in a Thriving Marine Reserve

The Coral Triangle is home to the Bunaken Marine Reserve, where we snorkel amid sea fans and giant sponges frequented by large numbers of endangered hawksbill and green sea turtles.



Commune with Sacred Red-Crowned Cranes in Japan

In the wetlands of Kushiro Shitsugen National Park live Japan's sole breeding population of the red-crowned cranes—a once near-extinct species that stands five feet tall and is considered sacred by the local Ainu people.



Seek Out the Elusive Dugong

Measuring 13 feet and 1,000 pounds, these gentle sea cows are cousins to the manatee and can sometimes be spotted in the bays and mangrove channels of the Okinawa islands, where they were once prevalent.



Visit a Bornean Sun Bear Conservation Center

At the world's only sun bear conservation center, walk through large forest enclosures and observe these endearing and vulnerable bears, which nest in jungle treetops throughout Southeast Asia.



Snorkel a Profusion of Reefs

Japan's largest concentration of coral is found in Yabiji, on Miyako Island. Made up of nearly 100 reefs, this system sits in fairly shallow waters, making it easy to explore, even for first-time snorkelers.

Asia is a continent of contrasts, where ancient monuments stand beside modern marvels, creating a blend of old and new unlike anywhere else in the world. Witness this fusion firsthand on voyages designed to bring you from bustling cities to serene shorelines to sample the continent's delightful contradictions and trace threads of its past into the future.

Ancient Sights



Hagi, Japan

Step into an era of shoguns and samurai in this picturesque castle town, where Japan's feudal past is perfectly preserved amid ancient merchant houses, and renowned hagi yaki ceramics are still produced by traditional artisans.



Flores Island, Indonesia

Watublapi village claims some of the finest *ikat*, or fabric-dyeing techniques, in the world. When other Indonesian communities switched to chemical dyes and industrially spun yarn, these weavers adhered to traditional methods.



Angkor Ban, Cambodia

Nicknamed "the lucky village," Angkor Ban was a base for the Khmer Rouge, escaping destruction at the hands of the regime. It is one of few places where visitors can glimpse traditional Cambodian stilt houses.

Ubud, Bali, Indonesia

This town's ancient history is rooted in medicinal herbs and plants. Today, rich artisan traditions like painting and stone and wood carving have helped cultural tourism replace the healing pursuits of the past.

Phnom Penh, Cambodia

Explore the Cambodian capital by *cyclo*—a bicycle taxi—to see firsthand how this city is rebounding from the reign of the Khmer Rouge, and witness the art of apsara dance during a performance aboard *The Jahan*.




Modern Delights

Singapore

Saigon, Vietnam



In Vietnam’s urban hub, colonial architecture stands in the shadows of neon and glass, chronicling the city’s century of rapid change. On a tour, trace local history from the French occupation to modern-day communist rule.

Tokyo, Japan



Get immersed in Tokyo’s techno glitz in the Ginza district, then experience the ultimate contrast to its modern cityscape while strolling the lantern-lit lanes of the historic Asakusa district, home to the city’s oldest temple, Senso-ji.



Vietnam & Cambodia

Experience the enchanting rhythms of daily life along Southeast Asia's most storied waterway, floating through the rural heart of Vietnam and Cambodia to age-old villages where ancient traditions still thrive. 


